INSTRUCTIONS FOR "FLY 50,000 FOR OUR 50TH" VOLUNTEERS

Requirements:

- Any flyer under age 16 counts towards the 50,000 target.
- The flyer must have participated in an NAR sponsored launch.
- The flyer must have flown a rocket.
- Please report **ONLY** the first flight of the kids flying at your launch. Repeat flights by the same kid, whether at this launch or future launches do not count.
- Only NAR members and Sections may report results.

Detailed Procedures:

- Estimate the number of flyers you expect at your launch.
- Print out or copy enough of the attached Launch Reporting forms and reward certificates for the expected crowd. (HINT: It wouldn't hurt to have a few extra.)
- Complete the top portion of the roster form: Date, location, the name and NAR # of the person reporting the launch results and the name and NAR # of the section sponsoring the launch (if sponsored by an NAR Section.)
- At the launch, have the kids doing the flying **print** their name and age on the form.
- After each kid flies his model, check the completed flight box in the right hand column.
- For each kid to have a flight, neatly print their name on a certificate, and present it to the flyer!
- A sample certificate is available as part of this packet, but feel free to create your own!
- Presenting certificates on launch day is very important reinforcement for these youngsters, but if presenting certificates at the launch site is completely inconvenient, you may also present them at your meeting, next launch or other event.
- Make sure each kid gets information about your club and an NAR brochure. If you do not have any brochures, contact NAR HQ for additional copies, or download and print them from the NAR website (<http://www.nar.org/brochure.pdf>)
- Count the total number of kid flyers at this launch
