

Summary: Addition of Staged Altitude competition requiring that all entries have two or three stages.

Logic: While staging is permitted in altitude events, there is, at present no class specifically for staged altitude. This event would fill a gap in the otherwise complete Sporting Code and may help boost interest in competition.

Effect: None

Wording: 24 Staged Altitude Competition

24.1 Scope

Altitude Competition comprises seven events open to any model rocket consisting of two or three stages. The purpose of this competition is to achieve the highest altitude.

24.2 Recovery

Models in the competition must adhere to the provisions of Rule 3.5.

24.3 Return

Following the flight, the contestant shall present his/her entry to a contest official as recovered. If the official cannot examine all stages, the entry shall be disqualified.

24.4 Classes

This competition is divided into classes based on the permissible total combined impulse of the motors. The following classes of Staged Altitude Competition are established:
