


Our Association Stats Membership

Our Association Stats High Power Certification







- Non-profit with tax filing requirements
- Efficiency in operations mix of employees, contractors, and purchased services
- Cash on hand: \$120K
- Net worth: \$299K



Endowments


- Jay Apt scholarship fund was put into an investment account with the goal of having it be self-funded in perpetuity.




- Current membership 9,347
